

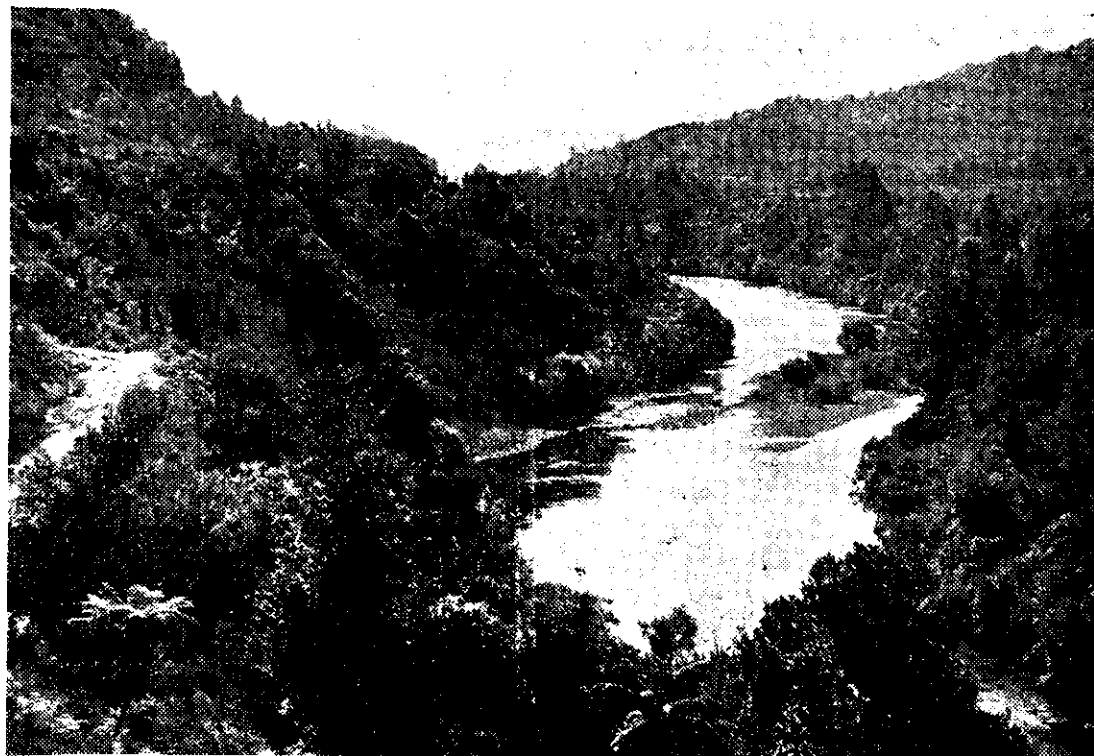


LOOK BEFORE YOU LISTEN
