3 NATIONAL War SAVINGS

Deposits from 1/- to £1,000. Repayable 30th June, 1947, with 3% interest. Interest credited on 30th June each year and may be withdrawn within six months from that date. If not withdrawn it is added to principal. Enquire at any Post Office or Trustee Savings Bank.
