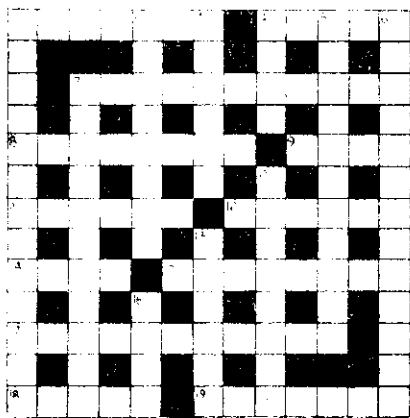


THE LISTENER CROSSWORD

(No. 211: Constructed by R.W.C.)



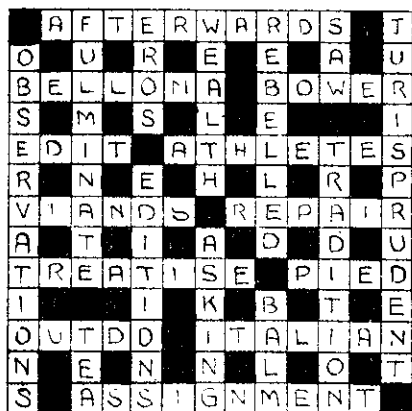
Clues Across

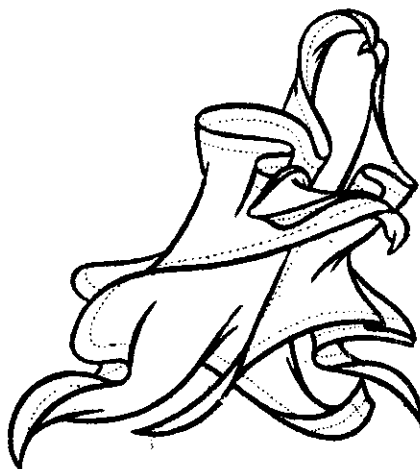
