

And finally there are the three innocent victims-the young rancher (Dana Andrews) whose agony of mind is as much for his unprotected wife and family as for himself; the simple-minded, pathetic old man who cannot understand what it is all about (Francis Ford); and the enigmetic Mexican (Anthony Quinn).

The Ox-Bow Incident, in fact, is the kind of film that restores one's faith in the cinema, by proving that Hollywood can occasionally produce a miracle much greater than the one at Morgan's Creek.
