For the purchase of farms, homes, businesses, tools and equipment £26,706,903 has been lent to 34,620 ex-servicemen and women. About 16,000 others have received allowances and special grants. 9,598 have been assisted in various types of trade training. Another 15,252 are

being helped to further their education; about 2,506 of them are full time students at the University, and 426 are studying overseas. The total number of men and women placed in employment by 'Rehab' is 19,465.
