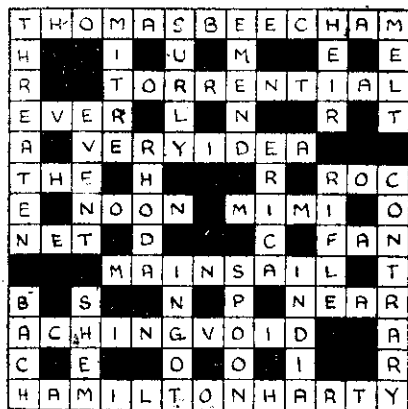


THE LISTENER CROSSWORD

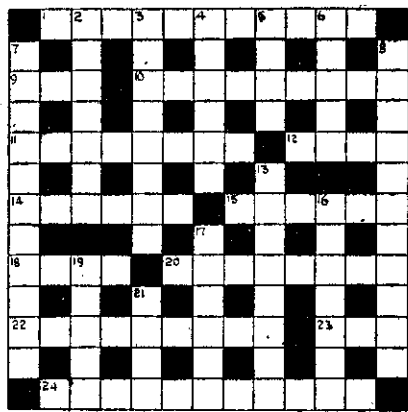

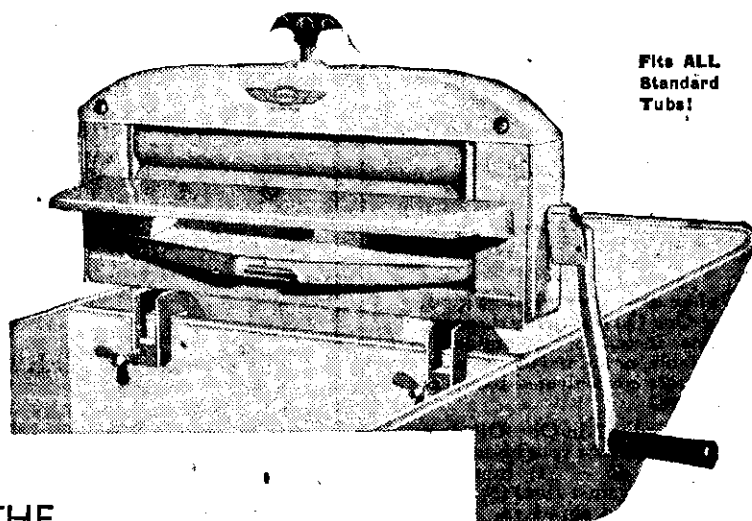
