Hindemith was 39 when he published this Symphony in 1934, and it bears all the marks of full maturity. The work was bitterly attacked when it was broadcast in Germany—the quarrel became a serious one and the accusations levelled at Hindemith appeared to attack the personality and the past, rather than the artist and the present. The various associations of radio listeners have been a powerful factor in controlling German radio programmes, and the mob with untrained ears and uncontrolled tongues won the day against a harmless, attractive and deeply interesting piece of music. Hindemith is one of the many who suffered from being suspected of a political rather than an artistic bias.
