This bagpiper is an eccentric musician out of the Bohemian fairy-tales, and Weinberger has made him meet a real but almost legendary character—Babinsky, the robber, a local Robin Hood who finally reformed and died, in 1876, as a peaceful monastery gardener. In the opera the two perform many exploits, culminating in a visit to Hell, where Babinsky cheats the Devil at cards. This scene introduces us to the most genial inferno in opera. One of Schwanda's fairy-tale feats is to start playing the bagpipes on the scaffold. He sets everybody dancing while he and his friends escape.
