play—which was a very bad one—scarcely
survived the first performance, but the

entracte, are very nearly the most popular
of all Schubert's orchestral pieces. This
music, by the way, was mislaid for forty
years after Schubert's death, and very
nearly lost altogether. It was discovered
quite by accident in a disused cupboard
by two Englishmen—Sir George Grove and
sir Arthur Sullivan.
