"The Arcadians," despite its brilliant cast at the Shaftesbury in 1909, won through on its merits, which is proved by its popularity among the amateurs. At the end of its original run its total of 809 performances was surpassed only by the records of "A Chinese Honeymoon" and "Dorothy" in musical pieces. Although the war sent others to the top of the list, "The Arcadians" easily holds its own in the public's affection. After thirty years, one of its numbers, "The Pipes of Pan," is still warbled by whole brigades of sopranos.
