When Haydn directed the music in the household of the princely family of Esterhazy, the members of his orchestra found it meant for most of them enforced exile from their own homes and families. Only one or two were able to bring their wives and families to the palace, which was situated in the country. That was the real origin of the "Farewell" Symphony. At its first performance, as the music neared its end, the players rose up, one by one, and each in turn blew out the candle on his desk, and stole on tiptoe from the room, until the very last notes were played only by two violins. This broad hint that it was time the players were allowed to go home to see their families so amused the Prince, that he acted on it in the right spirit.
