

As piano music, "Carnaval" is one of the outstanding achievements of the romantic period and can be placed alongside Chopin's music for perfection of keyboard style and heauty of effect. It comprises twenty-one short pieces which were written in 1834-35, and published in 1837. The present version is the orchestral one arranged for the Russian Ballet.
