We owe the introduction of this interesting work by Rowley to New Zealand listeners to Andersen Tyrer. It was played under his direction in Wellington at the final concert of the recent Centennial Musical Festival. The work is very characteristic of Alec. Rowley's Style. The music is lyrical and expressive, particularly in the slow movement, and full of pleasing and straightforward melodies. The harmonies are colourful and of an impressionistic character. The plano writing is not at all complex and very effective. The

nest movement is notable for its strong and vigorous rhythms, the second for its delicate and intimate feeling, and the third for its brilliancy.
