Chenier defends her against Gerard, whom he wounds, and the lovers escape. Later Chenier is captured and brought before the Revolutionary Tribunal. Maddaleine pleads for her lover, finally promising to give herself to Gerard if Chenier is spared. Gerard agrees and at the trial declares that the indictment against Chenier is false, but the moh, thirsting for blood, demands the poet's death.
