Born in Norway in 1856, Christian Sinding was one of three artist brothers. Himself a talented planist and composer, his brother Otto was a painter, and another brother, Stephan, was a sculptor. The musician of the family wrote a good deal

for the piano, besides chamber music, symphonies, and other major orchestra and choral works. The Norwegians thought so much of his music that the government gave him a life pension to enable him to devote himself to composing. His music, if a little facile, is melodious, elegant, and faultlessly constructed, and his "Rustle of Spring" is amdoubtedly a "best selier."
