Rosario Bourdon took up the 'cello (a most difficult instrument for an ungrown child), when he was seven years old, and two years later he appeared in public. He was born at Montreal, Canada, in 1885. When he was sent to Europe for study, he graduated at twelve from the conservatory at Ghent, with highest honours. He received also the first prize for chamber music. He then toured Europe as a child prodigy. At the age of sixteen he joined the Cincinnati Orchestra, and in 1904, he became 'cellist in the Philadelphia Orchestra, later taking up conducting with much success.
