Watter Gieseking, the son of a well known German doctor and scientific explorer, was born in Lyons. At the age of four he made his first appearance at Naples, and a year later played a varied programme at the 1900 Paris Exhibition. When sixteen he entered the famous pianoforte school of Karl Leimar, in Hanover, He made such progress that he received a grant from the State to pursue his studies, and from 1913-14 recitals of Chopin, Schumann, Liszt, and Beethoven were arranged at the Leimar Conservatorium for him, where he played before large audiences. Since then he has won an international reputation as a piantst of the very front rank, not only in the works of modern impressionist composers and their revolutionary successors, but as a player of the old masters and of Brahms.
