When Delibes began to write for the
stage at the age of twenty-one, he soon
showed that he had a capital "sense of
the theatre." He brought out some short
comic operas at the Lyric Theatre of Paris,
and wrote a number of operettas for other
theatres. After periods as accompanist and
second chorus master at the opera, he was
commissioned to collaborate in a ballet
with the Polish composer, Minkus, and did
it so well that he was asked to compose
one himself. This was "Coppelia," which
came out in May, 1870. Its run was
tragically interrupted by the outbreak, a
few week later, of the Franco-Prussian
war.
