"Concertino in F Minor" Pergolesi

Although Pergolesi lived only a brief span (1710-1736), he left, some very beautiful music in the facile and melodic style of Eighteenth Century Italy. His opera bulla, "La Serva Padrona" ("The Servant as Mistress"), always recognised for its enduring distinction, served as a model to subsequent Italian composers. Like many composers he suffered from rebuffs and lack of appreciation, one friend told him shortly before his death that his music was too beautiful to receive the approhation of the rabble. Dying of a tenacious and enervating malanty, he completed the score of this work five days prior to his untimely end.
