She follows him out of the valley and Orpheus still leads her upwards, never turning his face, in a cave, almost in sight of the land of the living, she cries out and weeps because Orpheus is so indifferent to her. At last be can resist no longer, and turning, gazes on the face of his beloved who sinks lifeless to the ground, Orpheus is about to kill himself when the God of Love, who has watched the scene, appears and, touched by Orpheus's suffering, waves his hand and brings Euridice to life again.
