Schubert composed eleven numbers as incidental music to a fantastic play called "Rosamunde, Princess of Cyprus." The play, which was a very bad one, scarcely survived the first performance, but the musical numbers of the ballet and the Entiracte are very nearly the most popular of all Schubert's orchestral pieces. This music, by the way, was mislaid for forty years after Schubert's death, and very nearly lost altogether. It was discovered quite by arcident in a disused cupboard by two Englishmen, Sir George Grove and Sir Arthur Sullivan. Glazounov
