The Poet's Love is a series, rather than a cycle, taken from Heine's poems, and no actual story runs through the sixteen songs. They tell, however, quite clearly of sorrow and a lover's broken heart. Beginning on a note of joyous exuitation, "In the Glorious Month of May," they reach their end with a deep sense of tragedy. But they were composed in the very happiest part of Schumann's life, begun about the time of his marriage to Clara Wieck, and finished less than four years later, before any shadow of fil-health had fallen on the complete happiness which united these two artists.
