Smyth Ethel Smyth's "Two Interlinked French Folk Melodies" appeared originally as an intermezzo in her comic opera Entente Cordiale: in which farcical situations are evoived from the typical British soldiers' ignorance of the French language. The two melodies from which it is made are both French folk tunes, the first a Burgundy vintage melody, the other a tune from Brittany. The opera was first produced at the Royal College of Music in July, 1925, and lud its first public performance, under the composer's direction, at Bristol in October, 1926.
