Mario Cavaradossi, the idealist painter at work in a church, encounters Angelotti, a Roman Consul and escaped prisoner seeking sanctuary. Mario helps him to campe in the disguise of a woman. Floria Tosca, Mario's flancée, and a famous singer suspects Mario of a flittation, and the suspicion is fostered by the dreaded chief of police, Baron Scarpia, who is able to show her a fan engraved with the name Countess Atavanti, which Angelotti dropped in his flight. Later, Scarpia arrests Cavaradossi for complicity in Angelotti's escape, and Mario is tortured in a room beside that in which Scarpia sinterviewing Tosca for whom he has conceived a violent passion. In her mental distress, Tosca tells the whereabouts of Angelotti, and the torture of Mario ceases. Scarpia now presses Tosca to yield her honour, and at the price of
