A young Polish girl of rank, Marina, wants to marry the supposed Dmitri and ascend the throne with him. Dmitri arouses the people to revolt, and rumours of the masquerader reaches Borfs, who is already repenting of the murder of the Tsarevich. When the would-be Dmitri arrives in Moscow, the aroused public condemns him to death. Boris dies of remorse, leaving the throne to his son. This presentation features the great Russian hasso, Feodor Challapin, in the dual role of Boris and Varlaam.
