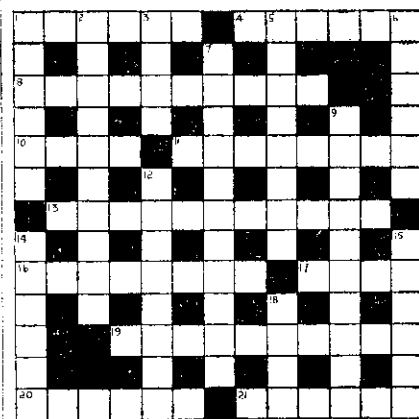

## THE LISTENER CROSSWORD (No. 170: Constructed by R.W.C.)



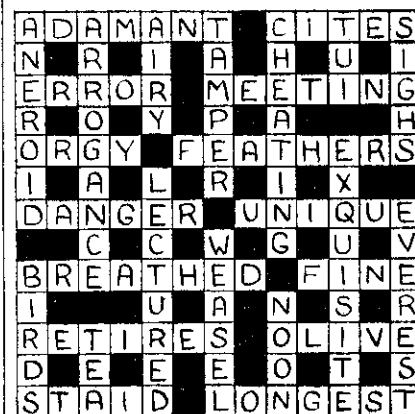
