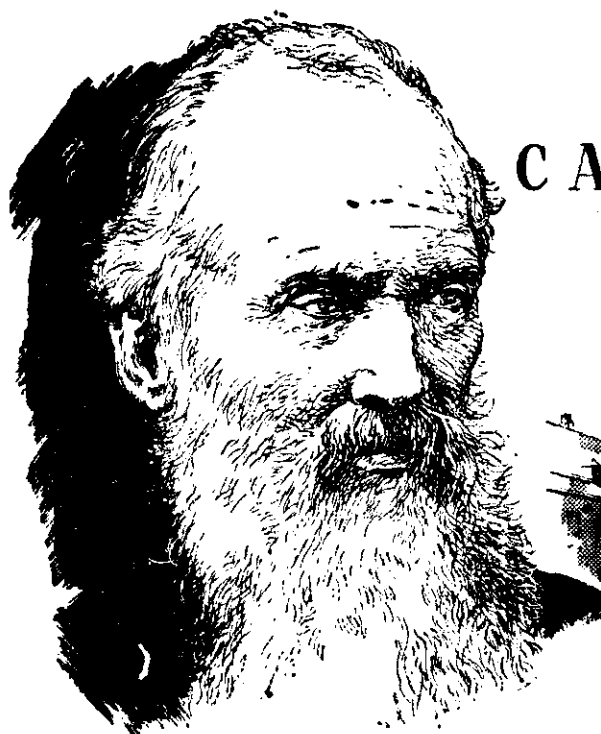

Lord Kelvin's versatility was remarkable even for a man of genius. He graduated from Peterhouse, Cambridge, in 1847, to become one of its most brilliant sons. His early contributions to existing knowledge were varied, and clarified many aspects of heat and thermodynamics. He later concentrated more and more on electrical engineering and his research on the theory of cable signalling was a major factor in ensuring the successful working of long-distance underwater cables. He also had a particular flair for instrument making which produced, among other things, an improved mariner's compass and accurate tide-predicting machines.
