



Duke Ellington was born in Washington in 1899. After winning a scholarship in Fine Art at the Pratt Institute, he studied painting and music and played the piano at parties and night clubs. His desire to write true Negro music was so strong that he refrained from studying composition in case it affected his creative ideas. Since then has become famous as a dance band leader, and as a composer of music that captures the different Negro idioms in their true forms. At 10 o'clock this evening 3ZB will feature Duke Ellington in a group of his own compositions.

Latin-American music is often associated with the music of Spain. There is a similarity in rhythm which leads to this popular fallacy, but in actual fact rhumbas, mambos, tangos and the rest are African in spirit and origin, having arrived in the new world with Negro slaves imported to work Cuban sugar plantations. 4ZB features Latin music at 6.30 p.m.
