

Nellie Lutcher, the bespectacled Negress with the breathless style of singing that leaves listeners equally breathless, was born at Lake Charles, Louislana, the eldest of ten children. She played the organ at the local Baptist Church when she was only eight years old, but on leaving school she switched to rhythm music to work with a dance band.
