Fifty years ago, if you mentioned the name of Youmans of Broadway, people would have thought of hats, for the firm dictated styles in headwear as surely as Vincent Youmans later dictated styles in musical comedy. Young Vincent began to play the piano at the age of four, and was provided with a first-class musical education for social purposes only, by his wealthy hatting parents, who were against the idea of his becoming a musician. In 1923 he put on "Wildflower," his first show. Between 1923 and 1933 he was responsible for many of the world's best known musicals. In 1933, however, overwork led to ill health, and he regretfully retired from the stage; he died in 1946. His music is featured at 4.0 from 4ZB.
