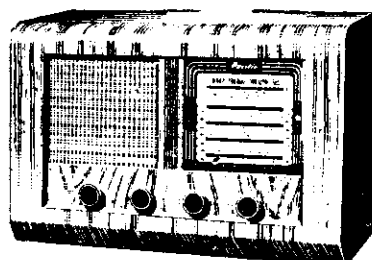

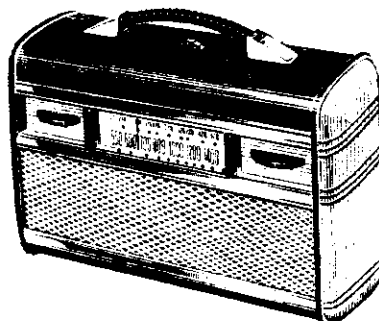
John McCormack's history is outstanding among the biographies of celebrities. He did not begin his musical career at a precocious age, and in his childhood he showed no extraordinary musical aptitude or ambition. He began by winning a gold medal in a singing contest in Dublin, and after making his first records when he was 21, he went to Italy to study. On returning to Britain he soon became the idol of the pre-1914 opera seasons at Covent Garden, and later was to impress America in a similar manner. He sings from 4ZB at 4.15 this afternoon.

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
