

WHEN Richard Lewis, now on a tour of New Zealand for the NZBS, sings with the Bach Choir, one of London's leading oratorio groups, he has one particularly keen and critical listener among his fellow performers:

Talking with Arthur Jacobs in London before he set out on his present tour, Richard Lewis discussed his reactions to working under such eminent

composers as Stravinsky, Benjamin Britten and Sir William Walton. Mr Lewis took part in the first performance of Stravinsky's Canticum Sacrum in St. Mark's Church, Venice, after Stravinsky had heard him sing the leading role in The Rake's Progress, and he created the role of Troilus in Walton's Troilus and Cressida, and sang

the Male Commentator in Britten's The Rape of Lucretia, Both Stravinsky and Britten, he says, are very strict in knowing exactly what they want, but in Troilus and Cressida Walton was glad to have suggestions on how the music should be sung, and Christopher Hassall, who wrote the libretto, was ready to alter some of the words to help the voice.
