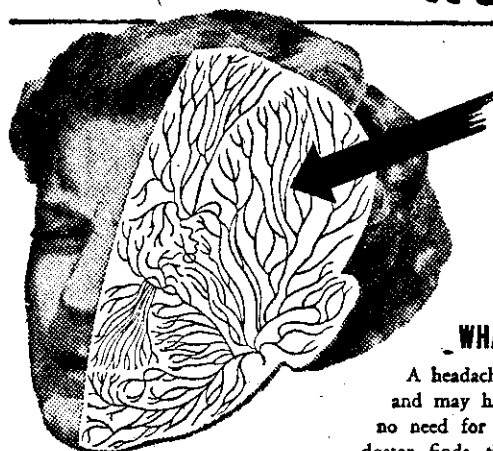

At 3.30 this afternoon 2ZB will broadcast a selection of melodies by the Norwegian composer Edward Grey.

David Rose, composer of the well-known "Holiday for Strings," will be the subject of a programme to be heard from 4ZB at 6 o'clock tonight entitled "David Rose, Composer and Conductor."

The American "March King," John Phillip Sousa, was born on November 6, 1854, and at the age of 11 was playing violin solos in public. At 17 he first conducted a professional orchestra and by 1880 he had become bandmaster of the U.S. Marine Corps—a position he held until 1892 when he organised his own concert band. Before his death on March 6, 1932, his compositions had included ten operettas, over 100 marches and more than 50 songs. Some of his famous marches will be included in a programme to be broadcast from 2ZA at 9.30 this morning.

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
