 Charles Ives, whom Paul Rosenfeld called the foremost of the Americans who have expressed their feelings of life in musical forms, was born in 1874. Some of the New England band music and hymn tunes he heard sung at camp meetings as a child have exerted a marked influence of his own music. Ives himself has written that the Concord Sonata is an attempt to present one person's impression of the spirit of transcendentalism that is associated in the minds of many with Concord, Massachusetts, of over half a century ago. This is undertaken in impressionistic pictures of Emerson and Thoreau, a sketch of the Alcotts, and a Scherzo supposed to reflect a lighter quality which is often found in the fantastic side of Hawthorne.
