Tonight at 7.30 4ZB features "Tunes of Yesteryear." This programme is designed to recall some of those old favourite melodies which are seldom heard today.

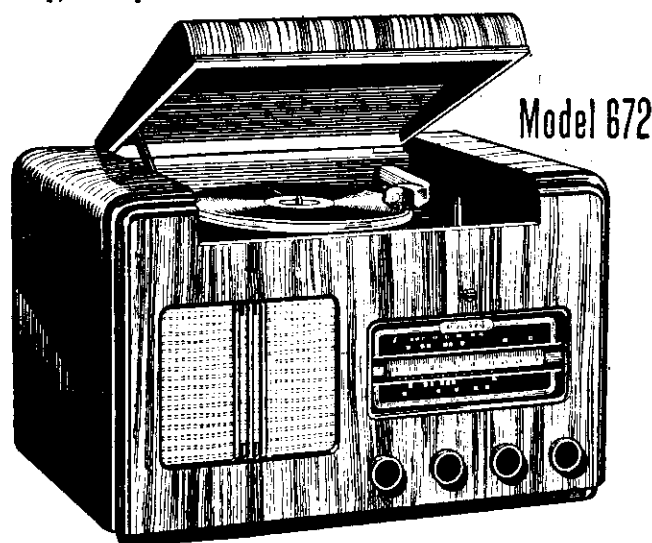
