Brazilian serenades Villa-Lobos
Both Milhaud and Villa-Lobos have taken considerable interest in Brazilian folk music, and these two scores, contemporary with each other, reflect this interest. Milhaud's score originally conceived as a piece for two pianos, attracted the attention of Jean Cocteau, who wrote an entertaining pantomime to fit the music. As a pantomime, The No Nothing Bar was given its first performance in Paris on February 24, 1930.
The Brazilian Serenades were written in Paris in 1925. Distinctly brilliant in flavour, and punctuated throughout with infectious South American rhythms, this score reveals the fertile imagination of Hector Villa-Lobos
