Westminster School, she says, is the only school in the world with a royal pardon for murder on the wall. This was granted by Charles II after a citizen had died as a result of a beating-up by the boys. Nowadays the boys are better mannered. and at the coronation they will have the honour of being the first to acclaim the new queen. Their cries of "Vivat Elizabeth Regina. Vivat, Vivat," will be heard by all who listen to the coronation broadcast.

Other talks to be heard in the series will deal with

coronation fashions and decorations, with those taking part in the procession, and with the servicemen who will line the route.
