The world's population, now about 2,350,000,000, is increasing at the rate of 60,000 a day. The world's food supplies are inadequate. By misuse of the land, millions of acres have ceased to be productive.

What can be done to feed these extra people? And how can it be done so that the fertility of the soil is safeguarded for future generations? How can we claim new acres from the unproductive areas of the world—the scrub, the swamps, the desert, and the frozen lands of the North? How can we reclaim acres which have been lost through neglect or bad farming? What are the effects of new methods of agriculture on health?

These are some of the questions asked and answered—as far as they can be—in this series. Within the limits imposed by fifteen programmes (two of them discussions), a team of experts range over the whole subject of man's treatment of the soil.
