Listeners are taken to the observation shelter of a high tension set in the nuclear physics section; they hear how the electron microscope is being used in bacteriological research; and are taken to the field station where radio astronomy, the newest science to be developed at the labora-WONDERS IN THE tory, is providing information on activity in outer space. The Cavendish Laboratory has a BACK ROOM close connection with radio, for it was Maxwell, the foundation director, who first worked out

mathematically a comprehensive theory of radio waves. Scientific Research is being heard this week from 4YC (at 8.1 p.m. on April 22), and from 4YA (at 2.0 p.m. on April 26). It will be broadcast later from other National stations.
