double-talk and this double load of horseflesh, that soon there are spies, bombs, and finally a medal for Groucho. Marie Wilson is the horse's owner, and Groucho waddles through the foolishness with his usual suavity and a rather inane lot of wisecracks. But he only just manages to keep the film alive. Since the Marx brothers broke up their famous partnership Groucho is the only one to have kept something of his old reputation, though as far as this comedy is concerned he might have done better to have stayed in television. The director is Charles Erskine.

"DICTORIAL PARADE No. 6" includes a visit to Roxburgh, Central Otago, where apricots are boxed for market or made into jam at the local factory, while pickers work in the orchards between the hills and the river. There are also shots of the axemen's carnival at Putaruru; and scenes from Maraetai dam showing how, after the damaged gate-lifting cylinders had been repaired and tested, the lake level was raised and the old river valley flooded.
