Few people will remember the Phil Harris of such early screen musicals as "Melody Cruise," but in those days the now famous conductor was one of the first disciples of the art of crooning. Since forming his band and acquiring a Southern accent to match its Dixieland flavour, Harris has duplicated his fame in another and, in his case, more rewarding field—recording. Some of his music will be presented by 1ZB today at 4.15 p.m.
