At 6.30 this evening Station 2ZA will present a studio recital by the bass Geoffrey Hunt.

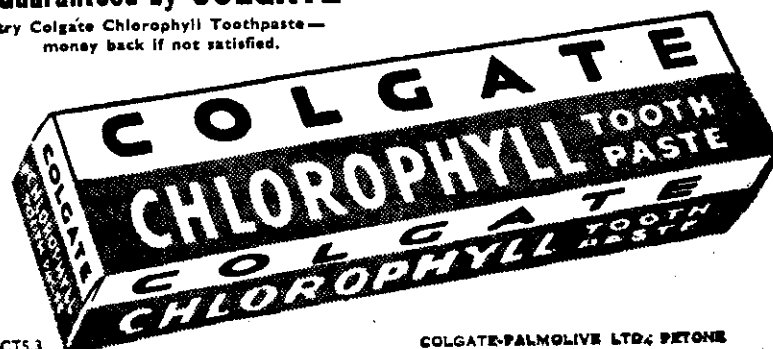
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
