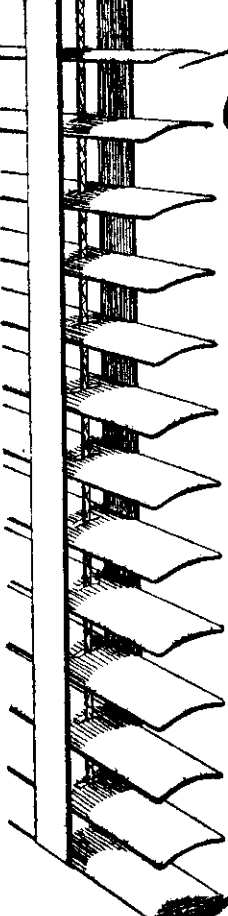

His operatic career has included performances with the Berlin and Vienna State Opera and also at the Salzburg Festivals.
