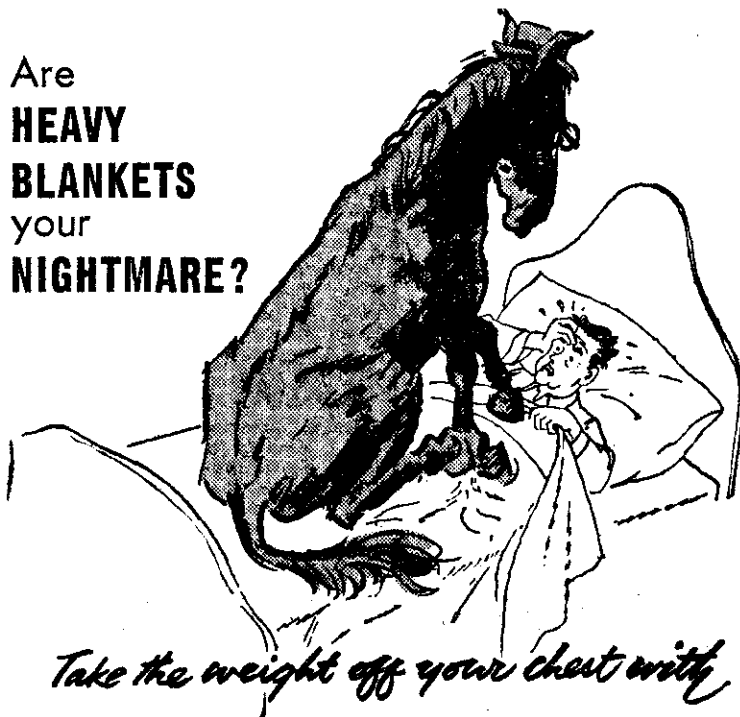

A tenor of unusual brilliance, Jan Pearce, strangely enough, began his career as a violinist playing theatre dates and with dance orchestras.
