Matyegka was one of the great concert guitarists of the turn of the 19th Century, and by this token one of the foremost composers for this instrument. Moreover, Matyegka's style actually provided a bridge for the styles of such Bohemian composers as Elitz and Stamiz of the Mahabehn period, and the later 19th Century romantics, Smetana and Dvorak, and thus must have interested the young Schubert, stylistically
