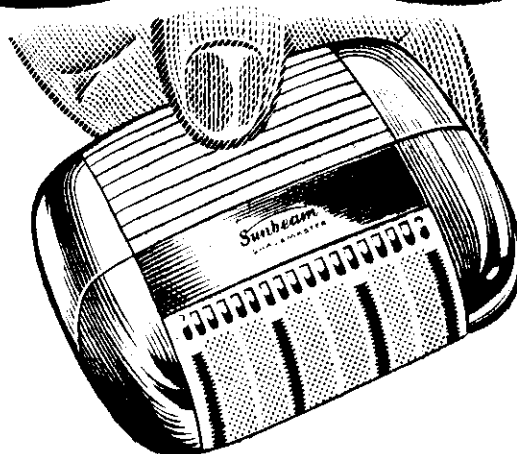

He became interested in the musical possibilities of the organ at the age of 17, and he at once began to teach himself the instrument. So carefully did he study that within the year he was a competent organist. He has had a long association with motion pictures as well as nightclubs. At 4.15 p.m. today 4ZB will bring you "Ken Griffin at the Console."

"Singing Stars," broadcast by Station 2ZA every Wednesday morning at 9.45, features today Richard Tauber, an Austrian-born tenor, who, during his lifetime achieved the reputation of being one of the most popular singers of radio, stage and screen, as well as making an enviable name for himself in the field of musical composition.



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
