These Sonatas were written at the commission of Hieronymus, Archbishop of Salzburg, and were to be played in the course of the high offices, between the Epistle and the Gospel; the entire service was not to exceed three-quarters of an hour, and the musical interlude was accordingly limited to four or five minutes. Mozart's Church Sonatas are not only completely secular; more yet they reflect Hieronymus's desire to emulate the glamour and splendour of the court.
