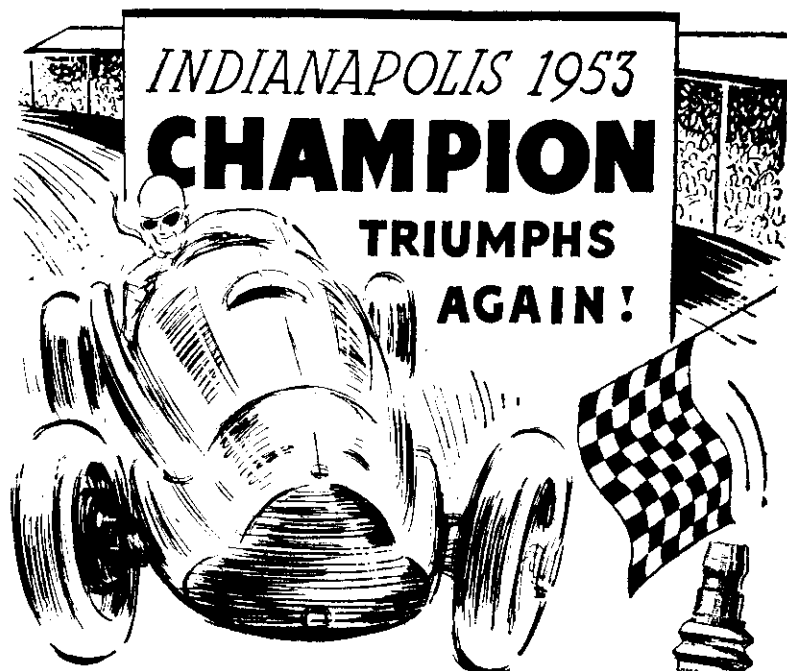

Before death stilled his inspired pen in 1937, George Gershwin had imbued the humble popular song with a new dignity and craftsmanship. Academic training and a unique gift of melody were among the assets he invested in Tin Pan Alley, and the dividends are a legacy America will long remember. Some of his great songs are recalled by 1ZB at 1.45 today in "Gershwin Memories."

David Hughes, an English tenor, has been described as a rival to Mario Lanza. Stepping stones to his rise to fame have been his recording contracts and increasing radio broadcasts. 4ZB presents 15 minutes of recordings by David Hughes tonight at 9.45.
