Cole Porter's first effort as a song-writer was a failure, so he joined the French Foreign Legion. When the U.S.A. entered World War I. he was transferred to a French Artillery School where he trained American soldiers. He was known at this time as the host at gay parties in Paris, but his reputation was misleading, for Cole Porter, even in those days, was a hard working composer of such top liners as "Night and Day." "You're the Top" and "Begin the Beguine." Some of his songs may be heard from 3ZB at 4.30 this afternoon.

Cliff (Ukulele Ike) Edwards once conducted a contest for players of the ukulele, and this was won by Gordon Jenkins, who, today, leads one of America's best recording orchestras. He recently became the first bandleader to compose music for a 3D film. One of his best known compositions is "Tzena Tzena." Listeners to 4ZB will hear Gordon Jenkins' Orchestra at 9.45 tonight.


