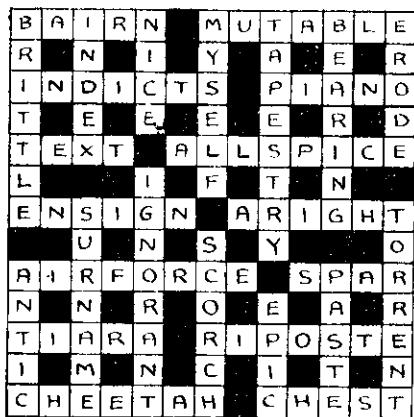

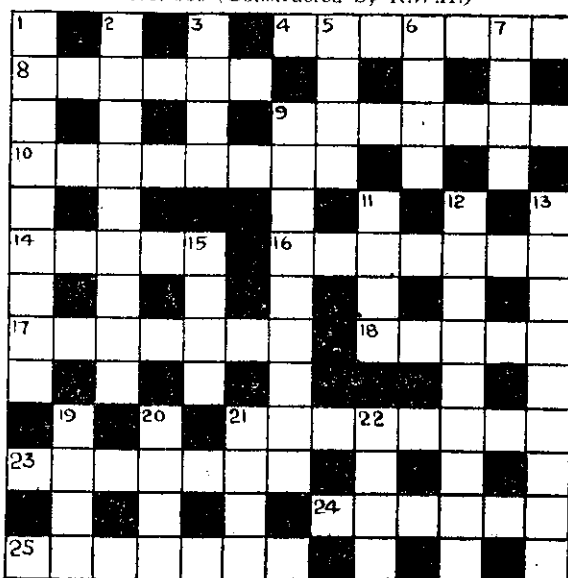

Opens skies long shut, pouring the new light*

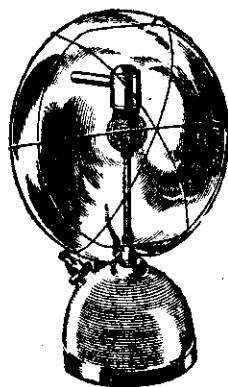
*Beyond belief. Even we,

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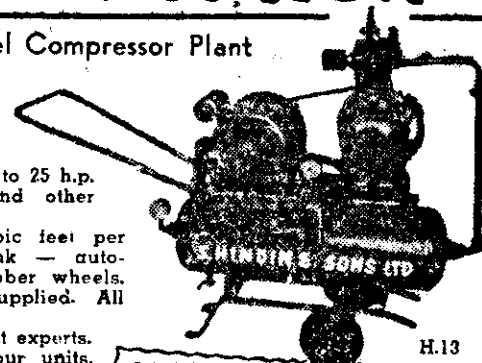
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
